<p>Requirements for a Certified Wildlife Habitat:</p> <p>Use these suggestions to create your own plan for creating a living space in your own backyard. It isn't difficult to make a habitat that attracts and sustains insects, birds, and others.</p>	<p>Use this column to record what you already have in place and a plan for adding more wildlife attractive features to your wildlife habitat.</p>
<p>Food: Native plants, pollen, nectar, nuts, berries, suet, sap, etc. Also supplement with feeders for birds, squirrels, hummingbirds, and butterflies.</p>	
<p>Water: Birdbath, lake, stream, pond, river, mud, bowl.</p>	
<p>Cover: Bushes, rocks, twig pile, dense vegetation, ground cover, brush pile, nesting boxes, tall grasses.</p>	
<p>Places for Young: Trees, logs, host plants for caterpillars, nesting box, pond, dense vegetation, meadow.</p>
