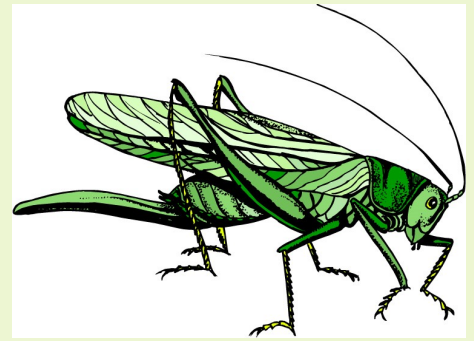




# Insect Photo Hunt



Insect study can be like a treasure hunt! When we focus on finding insects, it is surprising how many you will start to see in places you never expected.

Insect study using photography is a great way to help us observe more closely each insect by viewing the images in a larger format like on a laptop or desktop. Many times, you will find the exquisite beauty in each individual insect species by seeing them in this more intimate way.

Here is how to use the Insect Photo Hunt printable list.

- ◆ Make it your aim to find as many of the listed insect photos as possible.
- ◆ After taking a photo, view the images in a large format with your children. Try to identify the insect using a field guide.
- ◆ Print the photo out and adhere it in the child's nature journal. Allow them to write a caption for the image.
- ◆ Alternate idea: Print all the photos out at one time and make a mini photo album for the child to keep as a remembrance of their insect photo hunt!

If you print this notebook page, you can cut the list out and put it into the front of your nature journal as a reminder. You also may hang the list on the front of your refrigerator as a reminder.
